
Community is Aware Now

My name is Presley Abraham, the new Mayor of the Lelu Town Government, starting from January 2019. I used to work as a Project Coordinator for Kosrae Island Resource Management Authority (KIRMA) which takes is deeply involved in the start-up of the R2R Program – both the STAR project and the IW project in Kosrae.

The R2R Program started just a few years ago. During my time with KIRMA, I have experienced and noticed some changes since the start of the projects. A couple years before, we hadn't done any R2R projects, so since it started, we realized some changes that occurred in this project.

One of the main changes I've noticed is the water quality. At the state level, We have conducted several water tests to our rivers, and also to some recreational areas within the state. Data indicates that some areas have very polluted water.

Although there are no such developments to the water quality, we realized that through the information passed and efforts done by the R2R Program in Kosrae, our people are starting to be very aware of controlling and maintaining water quality and conditions at the ground level.
