Canoe Building Activity

Nauru R2R's end of project target is to build 5 canoes for each of the coastal pilot districts and 2 for Buada. This is part of the alternative livelihood activities for communities to ease pressure off the reef flats and for fisherman to fish in waters just beyond the reef. So far the project has only built one for each of the communities. All materials required for this activity recently arrived on Island and the project is working with the communities to come up with the next recipients list.

It must be made aware to the communities that the ownership of the canoe belongs to the community and not individuals. The project is to develop an agreement between the project and the carer of the canoe. The agreement will state that that the community owns the canoe, and the builders are the carers. The carer thus has the responsibility of scheduling times for fisherfolks to utilize and safequard the canoe(s),

The project aims to start building the remaining 4 canoes before the end of this year. Training sessions will be held in each respective community to enable all members to participate by observing and/or taking part, thus working effectively together.

Integrated Land Use Management Plan Consultation

Consultations were held with pilot district community members for the draft Integrated Agricultural Land Use Management Plan (IALUMP), held at DCIE, conference room, in the week of 12th September 2019.

Surveys were carried out by the LUMP consultant with households discussing the use of their plot of land around their house. The purpose of this IALUMP is to promote agricultural use of land in their communities and their backyard. Through proper land use planning, communities have the opportunity to work together to utilize their land more effectively to address food security as a community.

RZR Project coordinator Ms Phaedora Harris along with the Project's partners NFMRA and Department of Agriculture, carried out the consultation sessions throughout the week with the pilot districts of Anabar, Ijuw, Anibare, Buada and Meneng. The IALUMP has 7 components: ???

Comments and changes from the 5 pilot districts were compiled and sent back to the LUMP consultant to amend for the final draft version.

The final version of the Integrated Land Use Management Plan will be redistributed to the communities for their approval, before it is presented to Cabinet for approval.

Establishment of Kitchen Gardens in pilot communities

Nauru Ridge to Reef Project has established 28 kitchen gardens in the 5 pilot districts. The R2R Project's target is to establish and develop a total of 75 kitchen gardens with 15 gardens per district.

R2R has distributed/planted a total of 732 plants consisting of fruit trees (coconut, breadfruit, panda-

nus, soursop and marcotted tahitian lime) and food crops (banana suckers, sweet potatoes, pineapples, papaya, eggplanst, etc).

Nauru R2R is providing the planting materials to the different households and assisting them on how to establish their kitchen garden, how to propagate,

plants and maintaining them

The main objective of kitchen garden is to address food and nutritional security of Nauru. We also encourage members of households to take ownership and maintenance of their own kitchen gardens.

Nauru R2R Board Meeting

On August 28th and 29th, the 6th R2R Project Board meeting was held at the DCIE conference room. Project partners NFMRA. Department of Agriculture. Department of Environment, UNDP, and community leaders from the 5 pilot districts of Anabar, Ijuw, Anibare, Meneng and Buada attended this meeting. Project management unit and the district Technical Support Officers (TSOs) were observers. The agenda included updates for the 4 components from the Locally Managed Marina Area Officer, Land Use Officer, Communications officer, TSOs and the Chief Technical Advi-

sor. The Project partners NFMRA and DoA also provided updates regarding the Project's assistance in their ongoing activities.

Topics included budget, project grievances, issues/challenges, audit findings and gaps, project implementation report and the Pro-



ject's annual workplan.

The Project Board meetings usually happens twice a year to ensure budget is being spent on a timely manner or whether a budget revision is required; approve any major changes that are not in the project document; table any urgent matters that needs to be approved by the Board.

The next Board meeting is scheduled for December 15th.

Resilience & Sustainable Development (RSD) GEF Project Meeting - Suva Fiji

The Nauru PMU team consisting of the Project Coordinator, Director of Environment, Communications officer and the Finance/Admin officer attended the Resilient and sustainable development GEF project meeting in Suva Fiji on Sept 30th—Oct 3rd.

The Resilience and Sustainable Devel-

opment (RSD) team at the UNDP Pacific Office in Fiji manages the implementation of projects funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) through national governments. The RSD team had organized a four-day training in Suva, Fiji, on project management and technical aspects of projects with the objectives of improving the overall management

(including financial resources) of national implementation modality projects;

Guided by the Project Results Framework and the Logframe, implementing to achieve results with a robust monitoring and evaluation process, and gender priorities.

Topics discussed included project imple-

mentation management looking at delivery, identification of bottlenecks and their solutions, best practices and lessons learnt.

Group work to discuss such topics allowed other countries to compare notes on issues/achievements in their respective projects.

Nauru also shared it's Eben Omo campaign showcasing the Roadshow that took place in six districts over a period of 2 weeks.

Countries that attended this meeting also included Fiji, Vanuatu, Solomon Islands, Samoa, Federated States of Micronesia, Palau, Republic of Marshall Islands, Kiribati, Tuvalu.

Home Remedy for Ring Worm (Using Senna Alata)

What Is Senna Alata?

Senna Alata is also known as Candle bush or ringworm bush. It is a herb used to make medicine from its leaves. The leaves fold over in the dark giving it its nickname. It is the fastest growing plant but is short-lived. It is widely used in medicine for its fungicidal properties

l to treat fungal infections and ringworm.

The History of Senna Alata

Candle bush is a native to Mexico and grows up to 4 meters high

with horizontal branches. This plant can be found in a few places in Nauru, mainly at private residences. Locals plant this bush specifically to use as medicine for ringworm.

Step 1: Pick 10 single leaves

Step 2: Rinse and pound

Step 3: Put in bowl and squeeze 1 lime into hnwl

Step 4: Apply on affected area on the skin.

Step 5: Rub it on affected area constantly, the patient should feel the sting.

This can be done twice a day, preferably after each shower, make sure to scrub affected area with soap and water.
