The large number of IPs involved and the processes to be adhered to by different organisations and balancing that with UNDP and Government requirements.	This is dealt with on a case by case basis













#### Lessons learned in implementing Programmatic Approach

- **Strategy**:The project document is comprehensive and ambitious and responds adequately to the issues (as per the GEF Focal areas).
- **Steering**: The steering platform for R2R STAR is adequate with relevant stakeholders already included. The amalgamation of R2R STAR and IW is yet to be realized but is under consideration.
- **Cooperation**: Project Managers have supported each other in terms of technical inputs and lesson learnt from implementation for catchment activities, although R2R STAR and R2R IW work in different catchments, Waidina and Waimanu catchments, respectively.
- **Processes**: Adhering to processes especially involving a large number of stakeholders can be complex due to competing priorities but the agreements have also proven effective when balancing requirements of different organisations. Thus, some form of agreement is necessary.













#### Lessons learned in Programmatic Approach that could be upscaled
